Answer: Her father was a minister at Zion Baptist Church, and she was exposed to social work within the ministry and different types of people, both of which interested her.

2. What did Ruth Howard consider a "major barrier" to understanding the feelings, attitudes, and behaviors of the children she worked with at her job at the Cleveland Child Welfare Agency?

Answer: The lack of concern of school representatives, medical staff, staff at medical clinics for the children they served and their lack of understanding and empathy for cultural groups other than their own.

3. Describe Ruth Howard's doctoral research project.

Answer: Developmental research with 229 sets of triplets aged infant-79 from various ethnic groups.
