Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS) use will fall into one of three categories as defined by the FAA: Government use, Commercial use, and Private/Hobbyist use. Each category requires the UAS operator to follow different procedures before UAS use. Before using a UAS/Drone on or above University of Akron (UofA) property, or elsewhere on behalf of the University, the following instructions apply.

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- UAS use is categorized into three types: Government use, Commercial use, and Private/Hobbyist use.

Government use requires a specific approval process involving the Department of Defense and the FAA. Commercial use requires a Part 107 license from the FAA. Private/Hobbyist use is the most common and requires adherence to the FAA's 'Fly Right' guidelines, including flying below 400 feet and staying away from airports.

For all UAS use, operators must ensure they are not flying over people, property, or restricted areas. Additionally, operators must maintain visual line of sight and avoid flying in controlled airspace without proper authorization.

The University of Akron reserves the right to restrict UAS use on campus and other university-owned property. All users must comply with applicable laws and regulations, including those from the FAA and local municipalities.

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
